A Message from the President AL PAROLINI

You might have heard the saying, “measure twice, cut once.” Often when this is said it is in reference to making sure you plan and prepare for something carefully, efficiently and thoroughly before taking action. Not taking the time to make sure of what you are doing can cost time or money, or perhaps both.

As one can imagine the seismic retrofit and preservation of our Mission is a time-consuming and expensive project and the work we are doing now is a long term investment in the future. Planning and preparing is essential.

You may recall our planning began in 2010 before any of the work started at the Mission. After the creation and finalization of the Campaign for the Preservation of Mission San Antonio’s 501 (c)3, Mission San Antonio undertook a complete and comprehensive historic structure report, which identified the immediate and long-term needs for the retrofit requirements and historic preservation. As such, all of the work is being completed in full compliance with the historic structure report, which established the overlying theme – that work completed must be completed in a manner which preserves the original architecture at the time of its construction.

Every other week I travel to the Mission and sit in on the weekly project review meeting, which consist of the Project Coordinator, Brian Kelly; the Architect, Brett Brenkwitz; the General Contractor, Tim Gohr; and Joan Steele, the Mission Administrator. A weekly agenda keeps everyone on track relative to the open items to be discussed, difficulties which have arisen, and restoration plans for the immediate future.

In addition to complying with the State of California’s seismic retrofit law, the project team established the theme of preserving the Mission for the next 75 to 100 years. Our goal is simply to look into the future and identify those items which can be corrected now – invest in these identified items, which will immediately create additional work and more extensive repairs – but will preserve Mission San Antonio in its finished state for years to come.

In essence, Saving a Timeless Treasure.

Our careful planning of the seismic retrofit and historic preservation of Mission San Antonio is not only the most cost-effective approach and a wise use of donor dollars it will ensure the long term future of the Mission. ■

Reflect on this... a Retrofit Project Update

With the stabilization of the barrel vault roof and the campanario complete, the civil work has begun. This portion of the project includes the grading on the east side of the church and the installation of proper drainage, assuring that the church

will remain safe from water damage in the coming years. Following protocol, we made sure to have an Archeologist (Dr. Robert Hoover) and a Salinan Monitor (James Larson) on site while the digging portion of the civil work took place. It is necessary every time we break ground at the Mission, that we follow this protocol... with good reason. Sure enough, while trenching to install the new drainage pipe, we unearthed human remains. As protocol procedures require, all work halted immediately. The Monterey County Sheriff's office was contacted and a Deputy was dispatched to the Mission. The Deputy conferred with Dr. Hoover, Jim, and myself and then with the County Coroner (via phone call). The determination was made that the remains were non-Native American and after discussion with the Diocese of Monterey and the Coroner, it was decided that the most

respectful course of action would be to reinter the bones back to the same site where they were discovered. The Mission parishioners attended a blessing for the remains led by Fr. Phil Garcia, OFM from Mission San Miguel.

Civil work then resumed. A handicap parking area and ADA-compliant ramp

to the entrance area of the church have been installed. The water from recent rains collected in the new drainage system and emptied away from the church building, across the driveway and into the area surrounding the free-standing cross that is situated between the driveway and the aqueduct. Our drainage puddle has now evolved into our seasonal reflecting pond (sounds much classier, doesn't it?)

So, if you are able to visit us during the rainy winter months, be sure to look south and east and reflect on how much we've all accomplished together since this stabilization project began. Then, gaze to the south convento (now covered in wonderful, historic blue tarps) and consider where we're headed. Please hang in there with us... we need everyone's continued help... and about \$8.5 Million additional donations.

Construction Update

We are already almost two months into the New Year. Can you believe it? Regardless of breaks in the construction schedule to accommodate the holidays and some inclement winter weather, the stabilization of Mission San Antonio de Padua marches forward. With our permit in hand, Phase II work continues at a steady rate. Here's where we are currently:

- All roofing tiles have been removed from the south convento wing and stored on site; the eastern half of the roof is still covered with felt paper (this adds additional weather protection during the winter months).
 - The reinforcing construction work (stabilization cores, wedge anchors and epoxy) for the brick columns at both the south and north sides (loggia) of the convento is finished.
 - A total of 79 short cores at perimeter North (37) and South (42) walls are complete, deeper cores still remain to be done.
 - 37 short cores (including wedge anchors) in the center wall are complete (at middle of the building). All clips at trusses are installed.
 - Diagonal bracing (including coring) on exterior east and west perimeter walls is complete.
 - Additional conference room ceiling reinforcing is almost complete.
 - All roof blocking (for purposes of establishing a seismic diaphragm) is complete.
- For those of you who understand construction jargon, these details are surely enlightening. For the rest of us who are fluent only in English, all this means is we

are making great progress on Phase II. ***That's the good news!***

The soft costs of Phases IIIa and IIIb, the architectural construction documents for the west and north retreat wings are already in the works. We have not yet raised sufficient funds to cover the expenses of Phase III. ***That's the bad news!*** No, let's call it, instead, a ***fresh opportunity for you to participate in this extremely worthwhile preservation project of a priceless historic site!***

There's no time like the present for you to step up and get involved. WE NEED YOU!!

Mission San Antonio was not built by a commercial construction company in 1809. It was built by many, many individuals, one adobe brick at a time. We will save it the same way!
