We are so lucky to have Brian leading our project. His experience working on the seismic retrofit-preservation of various missions throughout the Diocese prior to our project has been a tremendous benefit, and due to lessons learned a huge cost savings for us.

His shared experiences over the past 34 years, including the Royal Presidio Chapel, followed by the Carmel Mission Basilica, and in his current capacity with the retrofit-preservation of Mission San Antonio de Padua is a demonstration of his love for the preservation of each of these sacred structures and historical landmarks. We are truly thankful for his ongoing dedication and commitment to our project.

In our meeting Brian explained to us Phases I-III of the seismic work have been signed off by Monterey County and phase IV and V will be signed off soon. As we look ahead we now turn our attention to the final steps for phase V, the restoration of the quadrangle and site interpretation. Restoring the fountain in the quadrangle will once again make it the center statement of the mission courtyard. The site interpretation and upgrades to the exhibit cases, to better protect the artifacts, will not only preserve and protect but will also enhance the mission experience for visitors. Add to this the restoration of the retreat rooms being complete, the museum upgrades done, and the seismic work finished throughout the mission—Mission San Antonio is on its way to once again becoming a travel destination.

Our board was energized by the update from Brian. We still have work to do, but so much of the hard work is behind us. We are looking forward to an exciting year! Thank you for your ongoing support for The Campaign for the Preservation of Mission San Antonio de Padua! ■

Seismic Conclusion and Protection for Posterity

IN 2010, WHEN THE NON-PROFIT ENTITY, the Campaign to Preserve Mission San Antonio de Padua, was formed, our state-mandated seismic retrofit project loomed dauntingly ahead of us. We began the momentous task of raising the estimated \$12 to \$15 Million dollars that would be required to complete our “Mission to save the Mission.”

On August 4, 2014, the proverbial “retrofit project train” pulled out of the station and we broke ground on the seismic strengthening of the Mission Church (Phase I of Five Phases). This work proved to be painstaking, intricate and ever-surprising. Working without any historic blueprints from the 1948 restoration of the Mission, the architectural construction and current condition of the building was literally a world of wonder and discovery. What was done on the east wall did not match what was done on the west wall, etc. You can imagine the frustration level. Fortunately for us, we have a cool-headed Project Team who

handled each “surprise” in the most professional and cost-effective manner possible to ensure the safety and accessibility of the church for the next hundred years.

After completion of the church in July of 2016, the project moved on to Phases II, III and IV... the seismic strengthening and necessary upgrades to aging electrical systems and the installation of a fire detection system commenced. The “train” ran out of fuel in 2017 and due to the lack of available funding, the stabilization project was put on hold. We continued throughout 2018 to progress on smaller projects, like the interior painting of the facility and the restoration/remodel of the parish library into a wonderful Mission-era reception/gallery, made possible by a grant from the Frances K. and Charles D. Field Foundation. We continued throughout 2018 to solicit funding.

Renewed by additional grant awards and donations received, work resumed in December, 2018, under a new general contractor, Brad Forde of B.H. Builders, Inc. Phase IV plumbing and ADA compliancy issues were addressed and work was completed in the north retreat wing. In January 2019, seismic work resumed on the eastern half of the northern end of the facilities – Phase V.

As we approach Spring 2020, we have almost completed the major construction portion of Phase V. Crews from Salinas Valley Roofing have already begun to return tile to the roof in this area. The installation of the new hood with appropriate fire suppression system, above the stove is complete, as is the installation of a new swamp cooler to introduce fresh air into the kitchen area. For anyone who’s had to work in this area in the summer, you’ll understand what a blessing this restoration will offer.

Our own personal Michelangelo, Pete Vachek, is busy painting everything that isn’t moving! We are so fortunate to have such a

talented painter in our own local area. Keep painting, Pete.

Phase V, however, is not yet complete. Replacement of water lines in the Padre's Garden (quadrangle area) are now on the work schedule. Repair and restoration of the fountain (with addition of recirculating pump) are in the works and promise to restore the soothing sound of moving water to this special place. The installation of lighting in the garden area will offer a special ambiance to overnight guests. Plans for the garden are currently in process, with the eventual goal being to offer an inviting environment to both our daily visitors and our retreat guests. The new garden will be a more natural, drought-tolerant, low-maintenance garden that will serve as an oasis for the Mission Community.

Phase V also includes the restoration of our site interpretation. Our signage is about seventy-two years old and shows every day of its age.

Through archeological research that has taken place on site for many, many years, under the wise direction of Dr. Robert Hoover, we know a lot more about the site than we did in 1948. We need to reflect this additional knowledge in the way that we tell our story. Working with museum consultants, The Sibbett Group, we are mapping out a strategy that will enable us to upgrade the museum experience we offer to our visitors. This includes upgrading our exhibit cases to better protect our priceless treasure and to use a limited amount of selective technology to enhance the telling of our story.

For the last six years we've been on an amazing journey. I now know more than I had ever expected to (or wanted to) about seismically stabilizing a historic adobe structure. That said, even with all the hiccups, all the not-so-pleasant surprises along the way, the journey has been amazing! I have been fortunate to get to work side-by-side, day-by-day with a wonderful group of people – from my fellow members of the Project Team, Brian Kelly, our Project Chair,

Brett Brenkwitz and Charles Franks, our Architects of Record, Tim Gohr of Eagle Construction and Brad Forde and Kevin Kritzerberger of B.H. Builders, Inc., as well as all our Sub-Contractors. I've served as a Board Member with Susan Gill and Ann Beckett, Co-Presidents of the Campaign to Preserve Mission San Antonio and have been privileged to work with that organization's Executive Board including Margaret Duflock and Natalie Rava, as well as all my terrific fellow Board Members.

I know that everyone is tired. It's been a very long haul, but we need to hang in there for the finale!

To save the Mission buildings was our first and primary goal. We have nearly accomplished this. The safety and accessibility of the Mission buildings, though, only serves as a backdrop to the entire Mission experience. In order for the Mission to remain viable for the future, we need to complete the "rest of Phase V." We need to ensure the protection of our priceless artifacts from the ravages of time and the elements. We need to preserve our foundational adobe ruins (scattered around our 86-acre site) from simply melting away. We need to tell our story in an articulate, accurate, cohesive and culturally sensitive manner.

It will have done us no good to save the buildings if we don't complete the "saving" of the rest of the site so that it will be able to continue to serve the greater community with an authentic Mission experience for many future generations. In order to accomplish this, we ask that you stay aboard the train with us. We ask for your continued financial and prayerful support ... helping to provide the fuel funds that will enable the work to keep going forward.

The train station of completion is within sight. The journey has been, and continues to be, important, worthwhile and amazing. Please let us continue the journey together. ■

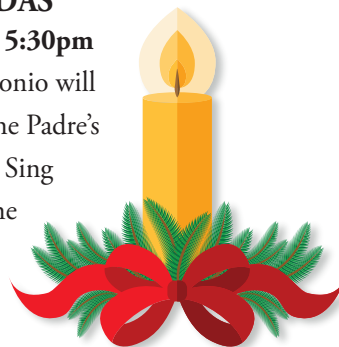
